ARPC FULL-AUTO SHOOT COMING IN MAY!

Spring is almost upon us again. At the Albany Rifle & Pistol Club, spring means it's time for the annual ARPC Spring Full-Auto Shoot! This two-day event is held every year in mid-May and plays host to the largest gathering of machine gun owners and dealers on the west coast. The firing line at the ARPC will be covered with exotic firearms with calibers as small as .22 long rifle (fired by the drum-fed American 180) and as large as 20mm (fired by the Lahti and Solothurn Anti-Armor rifles.) You'll see machine guns as vintage as original Maxim belt-feds, and as modern as the latest military and law enforcement products from Heckler & Koch.

There will be competitions for submachine guns, assault rifles, and battle rifles. There will be reactive targets near and far. There will be "suppressor-only" periods, where the loudest sound may be the firing pin hitting the cartridge primer. Most of all, there will be a collection of exotic firearms the likes of which you've probably never seen outside of a shooting magazine.

What's that, you say? You don't own a machine gun? Well, guess what? YOU DON'T NEED TO OWN ONE! There will be plenty of rental machine guns available for you to shoot. The prices are reasonable; the thrill is substantial!

If you've never fired a machine gun before, this is your chance! If it's not your first time, come on out and do it again! Bring a friend that's new to the sport. It will make their day!

The ARPC 2004 Spring Full-Auto Shoot will be held at the Albany Rifle & Pistol Club on Saturday and Sunday, May 15th and 16th.

The gates will open at 7:00 AM and the firing line will be hot from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

The 100 yard targets were set with Art Carmean giving the range commands and doing the scoring. The targets require scoring plugs to determine if the small dot is shot for an X or the line is touched for that 10. With five matches of five shots for score there is no room for mistakes with the quality of shooters we have at ARPC.

New shooters are welcome and all our members are willing to give any assistance needed. In fact if you come out to shoot you might just be offered a rifle if there is an extra. Try it you might like it. There is nothing like the feel of shooting a top of the line bench rest rifle.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIP MATCH AT WREN

I have some information to put in the newsletter about the May 15th & 16th state high power service rifle championship. It will be an 800 aggregate match on Saturday, and a CMP EIC "leg match" on Sunday, followed by a team match. The Saturday match will be 80 shots plus sighters at 200, 300 & 600 yards. The Sunday match will be the EIC match which will be the 50 shot national match course with no sighters. The four person team match will be 50 shots, no sighters. The match fees

will be Saturday - \$30, juniors \$23. Sunday - \$35, juniors \$28. A package fee (both days) is \$50, juniors, \$40 (both days) Team match is \$20 per team.

The firing will begin at 9 AM. There will be awards given - keeper plaques and award points.

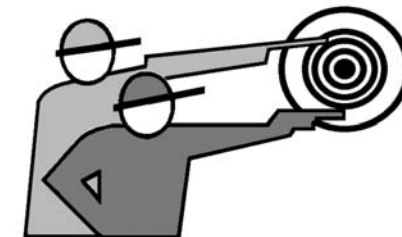
