However, due to Todd's hard work the evening before there were enough target frames to conduct the match.

This is not the first time a program was in danger of not being able to shoot because the target frames on the main range were so shot up the wind was blowing them over. The Ex officer Don Arnold has been doing everything he can to keep a main range up and running. The ARPC board is well aware of the condition of the range and has done everything it can to have a place for us all to shoot. Granted we do not have a good target system at our range but that is all the more reason we should take care not to shoot up the frames that hold it up.

However there are some people who cannot hit a 4' by 8' sheet of plywood at 50 yards and therefore shoot the red structures that hold everything up. Part of the problem is that rounds fired at 25 yds can skip into the frames at 50 and 100 yds.

The disciplines that want to hold a match on the main range will continue to help rebuild it all until we get a better system but it sure would be nice if more members that shoot it up would put in some work time as well.

MAIN RANGE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

The committee has been hard at work trying to come up with a plan for improving the main range. Our range is being shot up so fast that the EX board is hard pressed to keep target frames up so we have something to shoot at. We are too busy fighting alligators to worry about draining the swamp.

We are going to present a plan for developing the main range so that it will be as maintenance free as possible and have maximum use for all shooters. It is not an easy job and will take some real expertise. Gone are the days when a few guys could come out to the club and nail a few boards up on railroad ties and that would do for awhile. A good range wont come cheap either. All members who use the main range need to consider what they want. We are not planning a range for watermelon shooting but if that's what you want you have to speak up.

If ours was a one-dimensional range planning would be much easier. The main range is involved it just about every type of shooting we do at the club. The most common member is just the person who wants a place to come and shoot their firearms and doesn't participate in any program. Playing games and shooting a few dingers is just fine. Then there are still some rifleman in the club who would like to practice marksmanship with accurate rifles. A well planned target system with berms at regulation distances is required for this kind of sport. Dripping watermelon juice or other similar targets is not conducive to this kind of shooting. We have to decide what kind of range we want and plan to make it so.

ARPC MAIN RANGE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE GOALS 4/7/04

- I. The primary focus of the committee will be a recommended plan for improvements to the Main Range, such as:
 - a) Determination of the longest range target within safety constraints,
 - b) berm/target holder layout and detail,
 - c) Improvements around the firing line,
 - d) Provision of sufficient novel targets to attract shooters of all ages and abilities.
- II. Long-range improvements to the entire property will be considered, to coordinate changes to the main range with future changes to other components. These may include
 - a) Property development and/or acquisition, related legal issues
 - b) Capacity to fire centerfire handguns indoors
 - c) clubhouse improvements (new?)
 - d) Provision of sufficient novel targets to attract shooters of all ages and abilities.
